Back in 1980, I was asked to be a volunteer for the Special Olympics Michigan State Winter Games. Not knowing what to expect I said "Yes," and the rest, let's say is history. I was so moved and touched by the experience that I knew right away I had to stay involved. Working with the Special Olympics Michigan Athletes and seeing firsthand, what a difference that experience was for them (and me) is hard to put into words.

Knowing how appreciative they are when individuals, like myself, support them in their efforts to be all that they can be, truly gave me the spirit to ride. I am so blessed for the lifetime friendships I have made and will continue to make with my fellow Water Warriors, Special Olympics Michigan Athletes and Volunteers.

The Water Warriors Mackinaw Ride raises money to support sports programs for Special Olympics Michigan. Athletes attend local training and competition before going on to compete in regional and state finals. Special Olympics helps athletes with intellectual disabilities gain confidence, learn rules, and skills that carry over into other parts of their life.



Warriors Road Map

The Water Warriors ride their way 400 miles down Lake Huron and the St. Clair River.

The 26th annual ride will begin on July 24 in Mackinaw City and spans five days ending on Harsens Island on July 29.



Who are the Water Warriors?

26 years ago, a group of men and women thought that it would be fun to ride PWCs the length of Lake Huron for a cause.

In 1991, this group's dream became reality when they founded the Water Warriors.



The Water Warriors team consists of PWC riders and support crew members from across the state of Michigan and from all walks of life.

The Water Warriors trek the length of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River in an annual 400-mile PWC endurance ride to raise funds and awareness for Special Olympics Michigan.

Since their first ride in 1991, the Water Warriors have raised more than \$2.3 million to support Special Olympics Michigan. The Water Warriors are currently the Presenting Sponsor for the Special Olympics Michigan State Poly Hockey Finals, held each November in Lansing.
