

# AREA 30 LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD ARLENE & BOB BERNARD

Arlene and Bob Bernard have been involved as volunteers in Special Olympics Midland since 1973 when our program was established. They have a son Jim who is a Special Olympics athlete. They have dedicated over 50 years of their lives to Special Olympics! Arlene and Bob have been critical, vital, and instrumental members of our program since its infancy. Bob passed away in 2021 and we have lost part of a valuable team, but we are so thankful to still have Arlene volunteering with our program!

Arlene has volunteered her time and talents to Special Olympics without asking for any special awards or recognition, and she possesses a natural affinity for selfless volunteerism. Through her unselfish efforts, Arlene brought a greater awareness of Special Olympics home to the community. As a behind-the-scenes worker, she does it all without looking for public acknowledgement—just the personal satisfaction that she has helped our program. Arlene is also a compassionate friend who gives outstanding contributions of time, dedication, and encouragement that enrich the program and the lives of the athletes. Arlene is an upbeat, easy-going individual who brings out the best in everyone.

Arlene has served in many capacities, not only in our program but in other programs for intellectually disabled individuals. Her talents were used in coordinating the first annual prom for the handicapped in Midland in 1989. She acquired prom dresses/suits by contacting local stores for donations and altering the formal attire as necessary.

Arlene has performed many volunteer functions over the years, which included chaperone, chauffeur, fundraiser, ribbon writer, seamstress, baker, social chairman, creative designer, local liaison, and member of our Area Management Team.

Our program relied on Arlene's expertise and seamstress abilities when uniforms need to be mended, when banners need to be fashioned, and when aprons (e.g. for fundraisers) need to be designed. Every year at our golf outing. Arlene designs and creates a quilt which is auctioned at the Live Auction. This has always been one of our top-selling items! In addition, she works at the golf outing collecting money for the Live Auction.

Arlene has gone the extra mile in talking with the intellectually disabled regarding their life skills (e.g. how to tie shoes, how to count money, how to buy clothes, how to "act" with and "respect" other people and their possessions, etc.)

Bob served as a coach, chaperone, chauffeur, AMT Member, and fundraiser. The sports he coached included: Athletics, Basketball, Soccer, Softball, Walking, Swimming/Diving, Bowling, Alpine Skiing, Snow Shoeing, Cross Country Skiing, and Speed Skating. He was a certified coach in all these sports, plus certified as a Games Director and in Principles of Coaching. Bob attended the 2006 USA National Games in Ames, IA as one of our softball coaches. Our team brought home the national championship in their division!!

Bob was involved at the State Level for many years. From 1982-85, he served on the SOMI State Softball Committee when the State Softball Tournament was held in Midland. He also served as a SOMI screener for the sports of basketball, soccer, and softball. He trained our athlete, Don Krajkiewicz (the first SOMI athlete) on becoming a certified umpire for softball. Bob worked diligently with Andrea Ferrerio (formerly the Training Director for SOMI) in ensuring that Don was properly trained and instructed on the fundamentals of umpiring softball. Bob, himself, was an ASA Certified Umpire. Bob—on many occasions—took some of our athletes camping, hunting, and fishing. He also went on bus trips with the athletes to Toronto, Nashville, and Cedar Point. Though he was retired, instead of taking it "easy", he enthusiastically and selflessly invested his time in helping the athletes realize their potential. Bob was a role model, mentor, friend, and supporter to the athletes and volunteers of Special Olympics. He made many lifelong and dear friends in Special Olympics.



Covid did not help the situation, but we were having difficulty getting our programs back up and running, along with coaches beginning to resign due to various issues. John Muisenga called a special meeting in November 2022 to re-start and re-establish the organizational chart for Area 30. It is at this meeting, that Lisa heard the call and "responded" and took on the role as Area Director.

Since that time, Lisa has worked with past Area Directors, Area Management Team members, and Area 30 parents to ensure our Sports programs are back up and running properly. Working with John Muisenga (Assistant Area Director), we have made sure all of our athletes are properly registered now with the new Athlete Registration forms and Volunteers/Coaches/Chaperones are registered using the new "Voluntaro" system. I can attest to having many calls with Lisa to ensure our athletes registration is up-to-date and eligibility is retained to participate in SOMI Events! This is no small achievement these days.

Lisa coaches many of our sports programs. She is a head coach for our, now, 2026 National Games bound "Golden Knights" Flag Football Team. Lisa is also the head coach for our men's basketball team, the "Wolfpack". Lisa is also a head coach for our Softball and Soccer teams, the "Mustangs" and "Roadrunners", respectively. Lisa is always ready to help out at our regional events, such at the Area 30 Swim Meet and the Area 30 Track and Bocce Meet. Over the past years, Lisa has established contacts with the other Areas in Michigan, which helps schedule our Area 30 teams for their tournaments and special events during the year. Lisa makes sure our teams have all the equipment and uniforms needed to compete and look their best on the field.

For fundraising, Lisa has helped with the Wheelhouse/Area 30 Golf Outing over the past 4 years. This is our biggest fundraiser of the year, bringing in over \$75K, since 2000.
